## יצירת מערכי שיעור 🕍





As part of a lesson on climate change I would like to present an interesting experiment in class. The experiment should emphasize the dangers of climate change. What experiment should I present?



One experiment to demonstrate the dangers of climate change is the "Greenhouse Effect in  $\Box$   $\Box$ a Bottle" experiment. This experiment allows students to observe and understand how greenhouse gases trap heat, leading to global warming and climate change.



- Two clear plastic bottles with lids
- Water
- Food coloring
- \* A light source (such as a lamp or sunlight)

#### Instructions:

- 1. Fill one bottle with water and add a few drops of food coloring to make it easier to see the water level.
- 2. Close the lid of the first bottle and place it under the light source.
- 3. Fill the second bottle with the same amount of water and add the same amount of food coloring
- 4. Cover the top of the second bottle with plastic wrap, securing it with a rubber band, to create a "greenhouse effect."
- 5. Place the second bottle next to the first one and observe the difference in temperature over a period of time (e.g. 10-15 minutes).

Students will see that the temperature in the second bottle, which has the "greenhouse effect," rises higher than the first bottle, demonstrating how greenhouse gases trap heat and lead to global warming. This experiment provides a simple yet effective way to visualize and understand the dangers of climate change.

Ed Sheeran has also been called into court over one of his songs, as two songwriters have claimed that his hit was plagiarized from them [3] While Joe Satriani and Coldplay were also subject to a plagiarism accusation, Yusuf Islam (also known as Cat Stevens) shed some light on the incident [1].

I am teaching a lesson on using DNA test for solving crimes, Can you give me an example of a murder case that was recently solved using DNA testing that I can present in class?



One of the most recent cases solved with the use of DNA test was the cold case murder of a 26-year-old Pennsylvania mother in 1988 [2]. Police identified the suspect as Scott Grim, who had died in 2018 of natural causes. The DNA test results were obtained from a chilling letter sent to a local newspaper decades ago with saliva-sealed envelope [2]. Another recent case where DNA test was used to solve a murder is the case of Joette Smith, a woman who was killed 33 years ago [3]. The suspected killer was identified as 64-year-old Eric David Drummond. The Sheriff's Office thanked DNA testing for helping them solve the case [3]. These are just two of the many cases where DNA testing has been used to solve a murder.


